On this 25th day of April, 2013, at Adirondack Park Local Government Day, the Adirondack Association of Towns and Villages, the Adirondack Park Local Government Review Board, the Adirondack Park Agency, the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation, with other cooperating agencies and organizations in Local Government Day pause to recognize the work of former Assemblywoman Teresa Sayward for her longstanding and meritorious career as a Town Supervisor, Chair of the Essex County Board of Supervisors and State Assemblywoman.
