ConnectALL is Governor Hochul's initiative to transform New York's digital infrastructure, build a robust broadband marketplace, and bring affordable, reliable, high-speed internet service to all New Yorkers.

CONNECTALL OVERVIEW

ConnectALL will use federal funding for the Governor's five signature programs and to pursue specific objectives across all three of the ConnectALL goals authorized by the NYS Legislature in the WIRED Broadband Act:

- New York's digital infrastructure will **connect all residents and businesses** to high-speed, reliable, and affordable broadband.
- New York will have a **robust and competitive internet marketplace** to support economic development and benefit New Yorkers with consumer choice.

A statewide mobilization with partners in State, regional, county, local, and Tribal governments, and in the private, nonprofit, and academic sectors will end the digital divide.


ConnectALL is responsible for stewarding more than \$1.3B of public funding for broadband from multiple federal and State sources.

CONNECTALL DEPLOYMENT PROGRAM

The ConnectALL Deployment Program, with funding from the Broadband, Equity, Access, and Deployment Program, will fund deployment to unserved and underserved locations.



\$696 million

to reach unserved and underserved locations across New York State

Only locations on the FCC map are eligible for funding. Currently, the map shows ~95,000 unserved and underserved locations in New York.

The Challenge Process will further refine the map so that ConnectALL can allocate funding based on the most accurate possible data.


CONNECTALL DEPLOYMENT PROGRAM

ConnectALL will complete a multi-step process to confirm unserved and underserved locations eligible for federal funding.

ConnectALL expects the challenge process to require approximately 120 days to complete.







ConnectALL developed draft project areas for the ConnectALL Deployment Program.


ConnectALL took the following factors into account in generating draft project areas:


- Project areas were kept to single counties where possible

- Total number of locations within the area and average cost per location






- Evaluate Potential Economic Incentives




WIRELESS PLANNING & CELLULAR COVERAGE

Key Data for Regional Planning:


- Local and regional priorities

 - Federal data, drive tests, local experience
- Property and structures suitable for cellular infrastructure
 - Prioritize public assets.

Goals:

- Identify top opportunities to expand coverage
- Prepare the entire state to benefit from the FCC 5G Fund.

Next Steps:

 First region of focus will be Clinton, Essex, Hamilton, Warren, and Washington Counties in collaboration with the Lake Champlain - Lake George Regional Planning Board.
