The applicant proposes extraction of an average of 100,000 cubic yards of rock on an annual basis during a five year permit term in conjunction with the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation permit. The pit to be expanded is presently 34.1 acres in size. The applicant proposes to expand it by an additional 11.0 acres during the next five years. Mining activities (except blasting) at the project site such as drilling, loading, rock breaking and construction and maintenance of infrastructure shall only occur from 6:30am to 6pm Monday through Friday and 8am to 2pm on Saturdays. Blasting is to occur an average of two times per month (maximum four times per month), inclusive of small development shots such as access ramp creation, during the months of April through October. Blasting will only occur on Monday through Friday from 10:00am to 5pm.</p> <p>This permit consolidates Adirondack Park Agency Permit 96-347 issued April 15, 1997, Permit 96-347R issued September 11, 2002, Permit 96-347R2 issued June 7, 2007, Permit 96-347R2A issued May 12, 2008, Permit 96-347R3B issued April 2, 2012, and Permit 96-347R3C issued August 13, 2012 which is the current permit for the mineral extraction.</p>
