The attached maps show the approximate location of the project sites.</p> <p>Both mineral extractions were in existence prior to the August 1, 1973 effective date of the Park Plan and mining operations are ongoing. An Agency permit is required for both projects pursuant to Section 810(1)(f)(1) and (8) of the APA Act (Executive Law, Article 27) due to post-1973 expansions at each mine by more than 25% of the total ground surface area disturbed. APA Project Permit 2008-229 was granted on September 14, 2009 for an expansion of the quarrying, production plant, maintenance and sales activities at the Green Quarry (other than rock crushing), from 6:00 am to 4:30 pm in the spring and summer; and 7:00 am to 4:00 pm in the fall and winter.
