5. Executed Settlement Agreements:

One enforcement case was resolved by settlement agreement executed during the reporting period:

E2003-0152A, Magurk (Town of Moriah, Essex County)

Amended settlement agreement to resolve subdivisions creating substandard-sized lots in 1985 and 2002. Settlement recognizes lot as lawful, allocates a principal building, requires Agency review of any future septic replacement, places restrictions on lighting, and must be filed in the county clerk's office.
