


#### **Public Comments - Summary**


#### Q1 Replacement of Caretaker's Cabin



#### Q3 Replacement of trailer dumping station




#### Q4 Rehabilitation of water system


Q5 Replacement of overhead electric lines with underground system


#### Q6 Planting of trees and shrubs

#### Q7 Restoration of existing campsites



#### **Survey Results & Responses**

Majority were in favor of the proposed management actions

The following topics were emphasized:

- Retention of the facility's rustic character during infrastructure replacement
- Construction of additional campsites for both tent and or RV/trailers
- Include electrical hook-ups at sites
  - DEC does not plan to add any additional campsites nor install electrical hookups at any existing campsites
- Convert the first 0.6 miles of the East Mill Flow trail to meet accessibility standards
  - At this time, DEC has another approved accessible trail project in the area and the completion of that trail work will precede trail work at Sharp Bridge

# **Guidelines for Management and Use - Basic Guidelines (SLMP pg. 41)**

Primary management guideline will be to provide:

- public opportunities for recreation
- in a setting and scale in harmony with the relatively wild and undeveloped character of the Adirondack Park



# **Guidelines for Management and Use - Basic Guidelines (SLMP pg. 41)**

All intensive use facilities should be located, designed and managed:

to blend with the Adirondack environment;

to have minimum adverse impact on surrounding state and private

lands





# **Guidelines for Management and Use - Basic Guidelines (SLMP pg. 41)**

Construction and development activities will:

- avoid material alteration of wetlands;
- minimize extensive topographic alterations;
- limit vegetative clearing;
- preserve the scenic, natural and open space resources of the intensive use area.



### Guidelines for Management and Use - Campgrounds (SLMP pg. 42)

- Rustic nature
- Natural character
- Natural materials
- Shoreline setbacks

# Guidelines for Management and Use - Campgrounds (SLMP pg. 43)

 The older, existing campgrounds will be rehabilitated and reconstructed as soon as possible to reflect modern site planning principles that will better blend the facilities with the environment and comply with the provisions of the SLMP.

It is the opinion of staff that the proposed final 2022 unit management plan for Sharp Bridge Campground and Day Use Area conforms to the general guidelines and criteria of the Adirondack Park State Land Master Plan.
