Dear Mr Cooper,

I'm writing to let you know how disturbed I am at the prospect of restricting the public's input to the Adirondack Park Agency's policies. This uncomfortably mirrors steps that many government entities in the various States are taking to make themselves less transparent, to limit public involvement. The Adirondack Park is one of the very greatest institutions in all of the United States, and I have been so proud of it all my life. In the interest of full disclosure I am sending this comment from my perspective as former Agency member for nearly 16 years, during which I chaired the Agency's Park Policy and Planning committee.

Public participation should be an integral part of Agency decision making, informing both Members and staff, and leading to better decisions.

Most public comment comes from New York State residents regarding private property issues or Forest Preserve (public land) matters. Private and public land issues, by their very nature as a mosaic 'quilt', are intermingled in their impacts. All New York citizens are owners in common of the Park's public lands and their voices (and those of non-residents) should be heard, sufficiently.

The Agency should not reduce the already limited opportunity for public comment. In fact it needs to address ways in which public participation can be increased, an unfinished endeavor begun many years ago with the Public Issues Forum.

Dear Mr. Cooper,

In addition to our earlier, more comprehensive comments of April 12 and March , Adirondack Wild has one additional, final comment to make. It pertains to the APA's proposal to strike or eliminate from the Agency's Public Comment Policy the section concerning public comment about Unit Management Plans and their compliance with the State Land Master Plan.

We disagree with striking all reference to Public Comment About Unit Management Plans from the Agency's comment policy for several reasons. First, your Memo to the Agency board in March provides no written explanation for striking out such a large section of the Public Comment Policy. That in and of itself is confusing and concerning.


Second, public comment to the Agency about the compliance of UMPs with the Master Plan rises to a level of great, statewide significance. The Forest Preserve is owned by all New Yorkers, who have the right and responsibility to comment about its management and stewardship, protected by the State Constitution and guided by Unit Management Plans judged to be compliant with the State Land Master Plan.

To strike all reference to public comment about UMPs from the Agency's policy conveys a wrong and disrespectful message to the public, but also one that is also unhelpful to the Agency's ultimate evaluation of UMPs and determination of APSLMP compliance. APA State Land Planning Staff need and deserve the guidance about public comment opportunities for UMPs in the Public Comment Policy. It is a helpful reference to them and the work they have to do with DEC and with Park stakeholders. Striking all reference to such guidance is unhelpful to your own Agency staff.

Finally, while the APA-DEC Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) addresses review and approval procedures and public comment opportunities about UMPs and their APSLMP compliance, you have made no reference to the existence or relevance of the MOU in the comment policy. Your Public Comment Policy should continue to summarize UMP public comment opportunities while also citing reference to the MOU for more information.

Thank you. This final comment augments our earlier comments letters in March and April.

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Dear Agency Counsel Christopher Cooper,

I am writing as a New York physician and public health/environmental protection advocate who is submitting my recommendations concerning the fact that the Adirondack Park Agency (APA), recently proposed draft amendments to their Public Comment Policy to the APA board. The policy is intended to guide public feedback on Agency actions and operations in advance of and/or during monthly meetings.

I am now very concerned because if approved as drafted, these changes will constrain public engagement and disallow a critical legal function for public guidance concerning the management of the Adirondack Park, within our state government. These proposed changes to the policy recommend a reduction in public comment opportunities, and a restriction in submitting all public comments until the end of the meeting, which is harder for the public to participate and submit their recommendations for Adirondack Park management.

The APA board amendments will also impose deadlines on the time and scope for the public submission of recommendations for Adirondack Park management but with no deadlines for the Agency, reduce the time in which written comments on agenda items are accepted in advance of Agency meetings, and will direct the removal of text relating to written comments for Forest Preserve Unit Management Plans (UMPs).

I strongly urge the Adirondack park agency to please provide equitable and accessible public comment opportunities to assure that New Yorkers can continue to provide guidance to allow open and equal management of our Adirondack State Park.

The public currently has multiple opportunities to offer oral or written comments on decisions before the agency or on any subject they choose. Public comment opportunities are necessary to provide the APA board with key facts and perspectives that help them in their deliberations, ensuring that the APA is serving the interests of all New Yorkers.

The recently proposed draft amendments to the Public Comment Policy to the APA board is intended to guide public feedback on Agency actions and operations in advance of and/or during monthly meetings. If approved as drafted, these changes will constrain public engagement and a critical legal function within our state government and the Adirondack Park.

I urge the APA to please retain oral public comment opportunities at the beginning of the meeting as well as at the end, allowing for two windows of time for flexibility and engagement from the public. I strongly support the incorporation of remote comments to allow for both in-person and virtual comments at Agency meetings and I recommend that the APA please add language that requires the Agency to post meeting agendas and materials at least a week in advance of the Agency meeting date so that the public has sufficient time to review and provide written comments.

To encourage total transparency at Agency meetings, I very much encourage the APA to please openly state that the written public comment for posted agency materials should be submitted no less than two (2) full business days prior to the Agency meeting to allow for more robust and transparent public review and comment and I recommend that the APA please clarify at what time (e.g., close of business) written public comments are due under Noticed Public Comment Period and please completely restore text regarding written comments for Unit Management Plan (UMP) to conform with the APA's State Land Master Plan.

I strongly urge the Adirondack park agency to please provide equitable and accessible public comment opportunities to assure that New Yorkers can continue to provide guidance to allow open and equal management of our Adirondack State Park. It is crucial to remember that the

Adirondack Park belongs to all New York residents and to provide the needed guidance to assure full protection for our New York Adirondack Park, New York residents require more and not less opportunities to submit public comments.

The purpose of Agency 2- Public Comment Policy is to encourage public comment in a fair, consistent and transparent manner. Proposed revisions to Agency 2 - Public Comment Policy are intended to clarify and modify the Agency's policy for acceptance of oral and written comment.

Proposed revisions include:

- Clarify timelines and submission deadlines for written public comment periods
- Establish 20-minute public comment opportunity near the end of each monthly Board Meeting to accept both remote and in person oral comments
- Clarify procedure to sign up for monthly board meeting oral comment period, and
- Eliminate public comment period scheduled at beginning of Agency meetings.

Good Afternoon,

My experience with the agency's "public comment period" started in January when I inadvertently stumbled on the agency's plan to eliminate the Broadalbin Beach. I "discovered" the call for public comment on January 13, 2023 with the end of the comment period to be January 16, 2023.

The Agency may consider their obligation to the "public" by printing their intentions in their own internal releases for the benefit of their own select group of people they consider to be "the public."

What a joke. No one from Broadalbin was sent the information about the elimination of their beach. Had I not discovered the surprise, the APA would have moved forward with their plan without comment. Let's face it, the best friend of a bad politician is the silence of the constituency, and the best way to ensure that silence is to act in secret.

I am used to how the Army Corps of Engineers and the Ohio Environmental Agency is required by law to publish their intentions in the local paper of the area affected by changes or additions to environmental policies and actions. Further, those of us who were considered to be integral to the agencies for responsible comment were personally contacted.

As a result, my wife and I have been part of many community boards involved with environmental restorations. We were part of the community action group that provided input towards the creation of the Ohio Brownfields program.

I was the Co-chairman for a twenty-year ACOE project that exceeded 300 million dollars for the remediation of the Trojan Power Works, a DNT and TNT manufacturing facility operating during WWII.

We were members of the Board to oversee the decommissioning and removal of the nuclear reactor used for the Mercury and Apollo space projects. Both of these projects were located in the Plum Brook NASA facility. All were volunteer projects that affected our communities. The numerous meetings and processes were defined in local papers and all requested public comments.

Finally, in review of the extensive list of e-mail addresses (attached) I find none that show contact with any Broadalbin political board – not the Village or the Town. I also do not see any direct contact with the Clerk of the Fulton County Supervisors. As far as I can see, I'm the only one. The elimination of the Broadalbin Beach call for public comment was printed in the Leader Herald at my cost. Some "Policy is to encourage public comment in a fair, consistent and transparent manner" you have there. If it is my responsibility to inform the rest of "the public" please provide a budget. Tax law prohibits me from taking a deduction for the lack of commitment to the public by the APA or DEC.

From what I have observed, neither the DEC or the APA want any public comment from the communities you persecute. Sitting in your offices 131 miles from Broadalbin you plague us with your slanted viewpoint of the needs of our community while hiding behind your office doors and laws created to prohibit community interaction.

Matthew 23:4 sums-up how your agencies are run, "For [you] bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but [you yourselves] will not move them with one of [your] fingers. (Brackets mine.)

If you desire relevant public comment that matters, then come out of hiding and publish notices of public comment periods in the community newspapers.

I. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to encourage public comment in a fair, consistent, and transparent manner.

II. Background

The Agency recognizes the importance of remaining open to the receipt of public comment on issues of concern to the Agency and the Adirondack Park. Comments from the public very often prove invaluable as the Agency deliberates upon specific matters and general issues which come before it in the course of business. On the other hand, in certain circumstances, uncontrolled or ill-timed public comment has the potential to interfere with the conduct of the Agency's business and can give rise to an unfair or unequal exchange of information. As a result, it is necessary to establish an easily accessible and consistent public comment procedure which provides adequate time for the public to comment but does not give rise to unfair circumstances.

III. Agency Public Comment Policy

A. Oral Comments

A public comment period will be available during each open meeting of the Agency for the public to comment generally on Agency operations, topics of interest to the Agency or the Adirondack Park, or matters under Agency consideration. The Agency will provide approximately 20 minutes for public comment at or near the end of each open meeting of the Agency. If commenting in person, each commenter must sign up for public comment at the meeting location prior to the Full Agency reconvening at the end of the meeting. If commenting remotely, each commenter must submit their name and the phone number for the phone they use to call into the meeting prior to the Full Board reconvening at the end of the day. Each commenter will be allowed up to 3 minutes to comment. No commenter may cede or yield their time to another commenter. Time for comments and/or for each commenter may be modified at the discretion of the Board Chair depending on the number of commenters.

B. Written Comments

1. Noticed Public Comment Period

For matters for which a noticed public comment period is held, written public comments will be accepted only if received by the Agency by the close of the noticed public comment period.

2. Other Matters

For matters and issues for which a noticed public comment period has not been held, written comments will be accepted only if received by the Agency by the close of business three business day prior to the Agency meeting.

3. Proceedings Involving an Adjudicatory Public Hearing

Public comment will not be accepted at or prior to Agency meetings in connection with proceedings for which an adjudicatory public hearing has been convened other than through the adjudicatory hearing process. Those members of the public who wish to comment with regard to such proceedings should seek to have their comments incorporated into the official record of the proceeding.

IV. Legal Effect

Nothing in this public comment policy should be interpreted to affect or alter any public hearing schedule established by the Agency, nor shall any element of this public comment policy be construed to extend a public hearing record that has closed by its own terms.

The Board Chair may accept additional public comment at variance with this policy in the event that they determine that good cause to accept additional comment has been shown.

The Agency has reviewed and adopted this Agency Public Comment Policy, effective February 16, 2001, as revised to include the public comment procedure for unit management plan review, approved by the Agency January 10, 2003; as further revised to amend the public comment procedure for unit management plan review, approved by the Agency August 10, 2007; as further revised to amend the procedures for receipt of oral and written comments, approved by the Agency DATE.

HOWEVER, in having just read the Adirondack Explorer's March 23, 2023 article, titled, "APA's Proposed Comment Policy Changes Draw Criticism" and the Agency-Public Comment Policy Revision Draft with the proposed changes, the current action to change the process of "public comment" by this Agency does not remotely come close to meriting the more diplomatic approach! The Agency's intended action rises to the level of being despicable!
