Hi Dave,

We received your response to our January 25 Notice of Incomplete Permit Applications on February 11. This submission has started a 15 day review to determine completeness. If the project is deemed complete it will be noticed in the Environmental Notice Bulletin and only after the public comment period expires can it go to the Agency's Board for consideration. Assuming the February 11 submissions are complete the earliest a project can be brought before the Board is April 14th. If staff find that either recent submission is insufficient a second Notice of Incomplete Permit Application would be issued for that individual proposal and once a response is provided a second 15-day review period would begin. So it is possible for one or both projects can be determined complete, one complete and the other incomplete, or both incomplete. We will not be able to provide further guidance until staff have had time to review the newly submitted materials.

- 1. GIR Item 14c – New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC):** Please provide copies of any comments or authorizations received from the NYDEC for the proposed activity going forward.

- 2.** Please provide the response to Supplemental Information Request (SIR) Item 2 in a clarified format with all required information. Specifically, please provide a plant survey report that consists of a stand-alone document that includes references to maps and tables contained within the report. Staff review indicates the following items were not included in the January 10, 2022, submission and should be included or addressed in the report:
 - a. Review of the provided data does not indicate that the methods for sampling and protocols outlined in the application were followed. Please clarify.
 - b. Please provide narratives referencing the provided tables and maps with explanations and relevance.
 - c. Please provide a discussion of expected short and long-term impacts to non-target species as well as actions proposed to be undertaken to avoid or limit impacts to the native vegetation species determined to have moderate to high susceptibility to the proposed herbicide. In particular, application materials indicate that *Myriophyllum alterniflorum* is present within and adjacent to the treatment and will likely be impacted by the proposed treatment. Please provide a detailed discussion of what the impacts of ProcellaCOR EC are on *Myriophyllum alterniflorum*. Please also explain how impacts will be avoided, and if not avoidable, how impacts will be minimized. For example, actions to avoid or minimize impacts could include altering herbicide application timing, isolating or temporarily relocating specific individuals found to be present immediately prior to treatment, and/or additional pre- and post-monitoring. Please feel free to contact the agency to discuss possible actions with appropriate staff.
 - d. Please provide a map of the proposed treatment area with overlays of non-target species and a revised map for *Myriophyllum alterniflorum* showing the area in the vicinity of Sucker Brook delta where the species was observed but not recorded in the rake toss survey.
 - e. Please provide copies of the report Heilman 2019 and any reports prepared by Darrin Freshwater Institute that includes the *Myriophyllum alterniflorum* data provided in your response to SIR Item 2.

- 3.** The response to SIR Item 5 states “Milfoil control from the proposed herbicide application is expected to exceed 95% of the treatment area, and last for at least two growing seasons.” Please clarify this statement. For example, are 95% of

all milfoil species expected to be impacted for at least two growing seasons, or will there be a 95% reduction of Eurasian watermilfoil abundance (and/or area)?

4. The response to SIR Item 6 states that ProcellaCOR EC has excellent sensitivity to milfoil. Please provide additional information outlining the chemical's sensitivity to *Myriophyllum spicatum* as compared to other milfoil species, including those species found in the 2021 plant survey. The information should include, as available, pre- and post-treatment reports and treatment concentrations from other ProcellaCOR EC treatments and results of bioassay analyses (including any that may have been undertaken by the manufacturer).
5. Based upon the information contained in the file named "Copy of Lake George Harvest Data," management of *Myriophyllum spicatum* in Blair's Bay was discontinued after 2017. Please provide an overview explaining why management was discontinued at this site.
6. Please revise the proposal to clarify that the post-treatment plant survey will occur at approximately the same time of year as the pre-treatment survey. Furthermore, please clarify at what water depth the water samples will be collected to determine ProcellaCOR EC concentrations. If the sample is not a composite sample of the water column, provide the basis for why the proposed depth is appropriate and representative of the water column at the site. Please revise the water sampling plan to include a sampling event to occur more than one but less than three hours after treatment for locations BB1, BB2, and BB3.

Please remove or change the symbol identifying the location as "Blairs Bay". Sample Point BB1 should be moved further south and into the interior of the treatment area, while Sample Point BB2 should be moved to the area where *M. alterniflorum* was observed but not recorded in the plant survey report (i.e., within that area requested to be identified on the distribution map for *M. alterniflorum*).

The ProcellaCOR EC monitoring plan should include detail all steps taken to ensure no cross-site contamination of water samples.

Please provide the entire proposed water and plant survey as a single stand-alone document.

Subject: Alterniflorum

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Good morning Glenn and Leigh. Thanks for working on this issue. I spoke with Leigh yesterday and Bob Bombard this morning to get a better understanding. From what I gather, *M. altiniflorum* has historically been found at more than 20 out of 140 DFWI surveyed locations in Lake George. Given this information from the historical survey, it does not appear that this plant is exceedingly rare in Lake George, so a transplanting

effort may not be warranted. However, I understand Leigh's concerns, and looking to the long-term, I am willing to commit that the Commission will undertake a survey of dozens of the sites that were identified as maintaining altniflorum populations in the summer of 2022. This will be post-treatment, but it will certainly help with any long-term concerns related to this plant and potential future treatment areas. Given the fact that since this plant happened to be found at both of our four-acre survey sites, when the lake has thousands of acres of littoral area, the math would indicate an exceedingly small probability that the plant is not present at many other locations.

Leigh, I hope this commitment satisfies the APA's concerns on this issue. Please reach out at any time if you would like to discuss further.

Hi Dave,

Not sure if you got my text. Leigh brought up the suggestion that we collect, store and reintroduce up to half of the *M. alterniflorum* plants from Blairs Bay to avoid herbicide impacts. I explained that my conversation with Bob Bombard indicated that the plant was so abundant in Lake George that such an action wouldn't be necessary. I also explained that from my conversation with you, you did not feel that was warranted, and I was reluctant to discuss that concept further until you had an opportunity to participate. Leigh did comment that although this particular project might not justify the effort, that future projects would include this same concern over *M. alterniflorum*, and that it would be good to address it up front, suggesting that Lake George might want to do this for the good of others. The conversation ended there.

Would you speak to Leigh and share your opinion of the harvest/reintroduce effort? I mentioned the additional cost, and shared an email with Leigh that DEC doesn't want anything to do with it.

Let me know if I was off base on my comments.

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Good morning Leigh and Brian,

Attached, please find the only proposal the Commission received (bids due yesterday)

for an upcoming four year contract for DASH milfoil control on Lake George. The Commission's current contractor, AE Commercial Diving submitted the proposal. The cost has gone up from \$7,500 per week to \$8,750 per week, with just one person harvesting per dive crew (we try to use four crews at a time as funding allows, so \$35,000 per week is what we spend on Lake George currently).

AE is an excellent company to work with, and very diligent in what they do, but it's very expensive. We spent a combined \$1.3 million in just the past three years on this strategy on Lake George, and while we have made good progress, the costs are simply unsustainable and our grant funding has been expended.

By contrast, Minerva Lake's treatment with ProcellaCOR (similar combined acreage to our Lake George DASH efforts) was completed for less money than we spend in a week on our Lake George DASH program. Very importantly, Minerva also spent zero dollars the following year (and probably the next few as well), with no recurrent milfoil identified subsequent to management, which is absolutely unheard of in our DASH program.

Also attached is a new Excel file from Amy Smagula from New Hampshire who manages their invasives program. When compared to the costs of New Hampshire's ProcellaCOR treatments, continuing our traditional DASH program for our difficult bays makes little financial (and ultimately environmental) sense versus ProcellaCOR. I think our three state agencies share the collective goal of establishing long-term milfoil reductions in Lake George that minimize impacts to the lake. While DASH can be effective, the turbidity and nutrient resuspension from pulling tens of thousands of plant every year concerns all of us. We spend much of the summer in Harris Bay pulling milfoil (our largest and most problematic site), and this bay experienced our first ever HAB two years ago.

I just thought it very important that I present to you the bigger picture of milfoil control on Lake George and the long-term challenges we face. Thank you both for your considerable effort on our applications; we realize it takes a lot of work on the regulatory side to get a project prepared for final consideration.
