Once there is no longer an immediate threat to life or property, the Applicant shall seek authorization from the Agency for any additional planned repairs, remediation or recovery from the emergency.

Emergency Project Description

On July 10 & 11, 2024, heavy rain and severe flooding created hazardous conditions in New York State posing an imminent danger to public transportation, utility service, public health, and public safety systems. The storm caused significant damage to State Route 30 in the Town of Long Lake. The proposed project involves the repair of the shoulder and lanes on State Route 30, and the backfilling and repaving of a small section of road where a culvert was displaced.
