Emergency Project Description

On July 10 & 11, 2024, heavy rain and severe flooding created hazardous conditions in New York State posing an imminent danger to public transportation, utility service, public health, and public safety systems. The storm caused significant damage to Tooley Pond Road in the Town of Clare. The proposed project involves the repair of shoulders and lanes on Tooley Pond Road, and the replacement of three culverts where they were displaced at Allen Pond, First Brook Outlet, and Second Brook Outlet.
