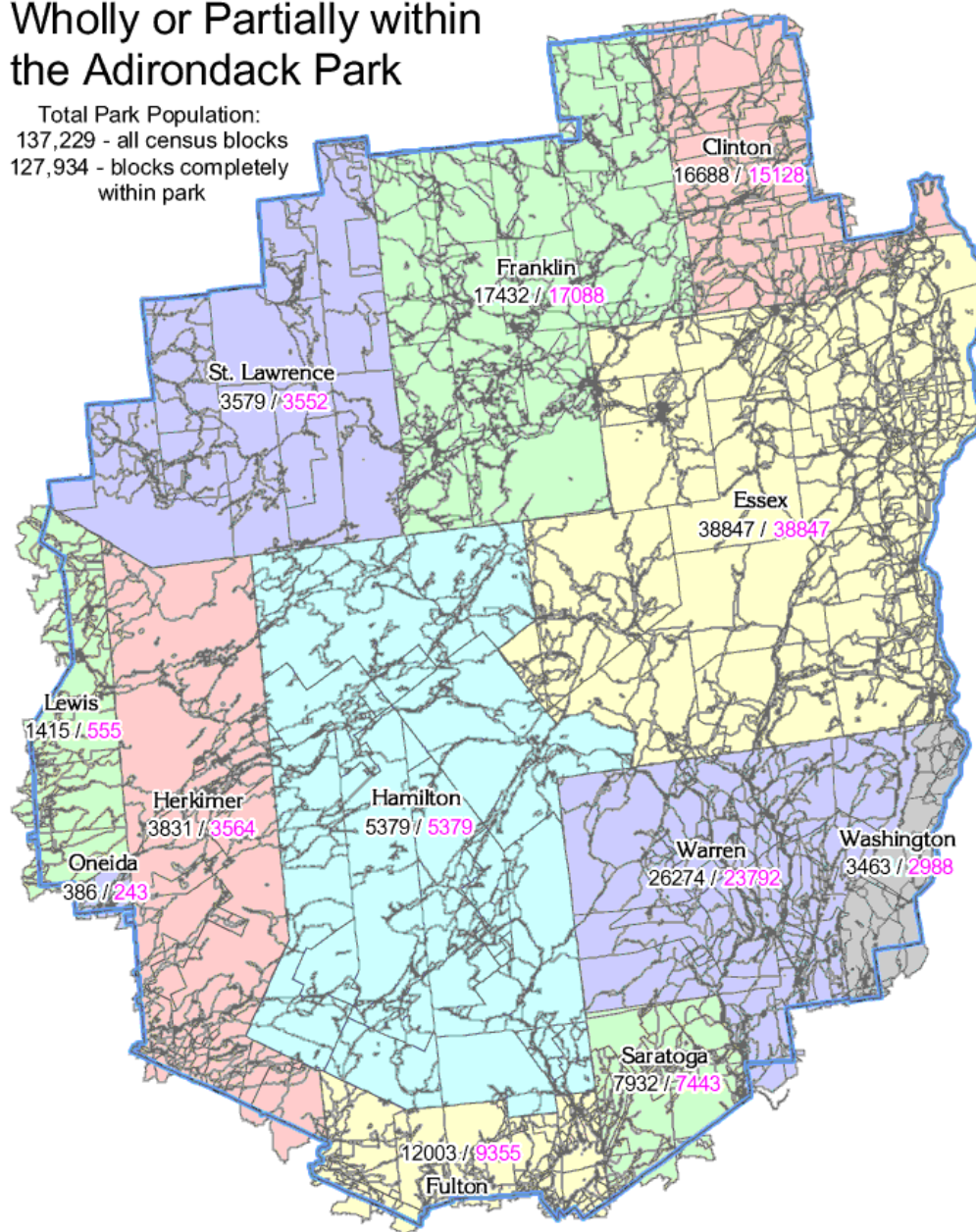
CENSUS BLOCK

Census blocks are areas bounded on all sides by visible features, such as streets, roads, streams, and railroad tracks, and by invisible boundaries, such as city, town, township, and county limits, property lines, and short, imaginary extensions of streets and roads.

Generally, census blocks are small in area; for example, a block bounded by city streets. However, census blocks in remote areas may be large and irregular and contain many square miles.

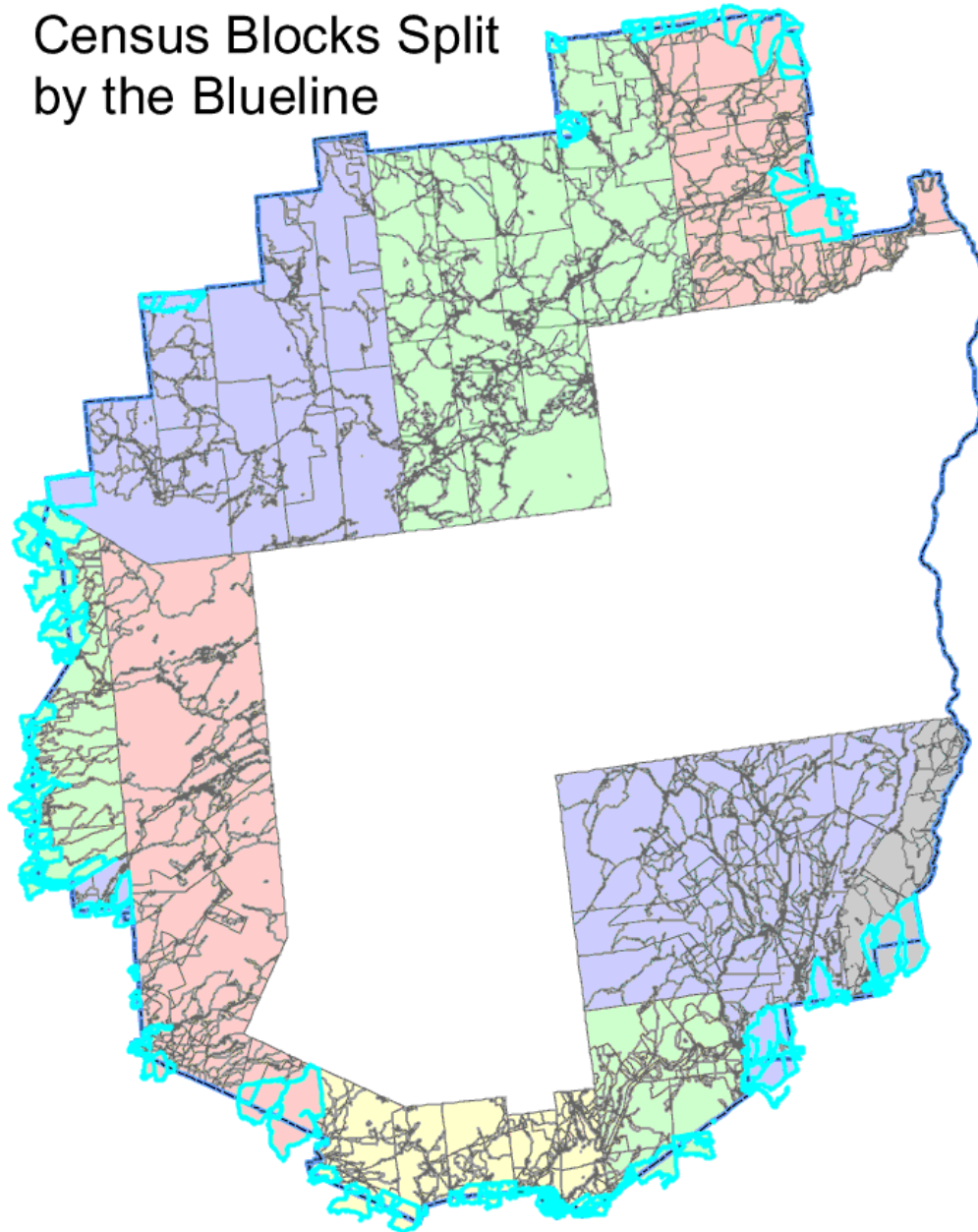
2000 Census Blocks Wholly or Partially within the Adirondack Park

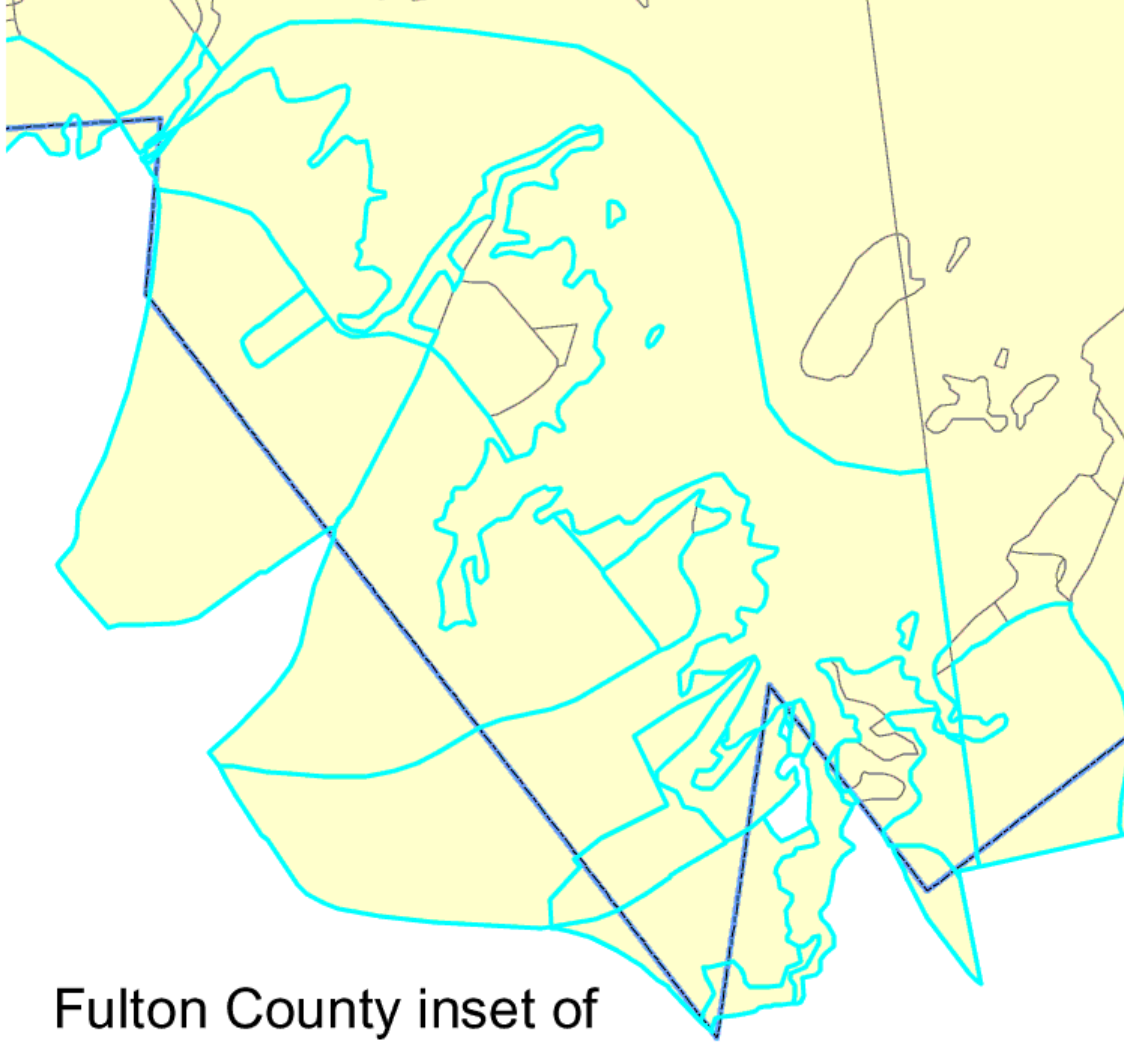

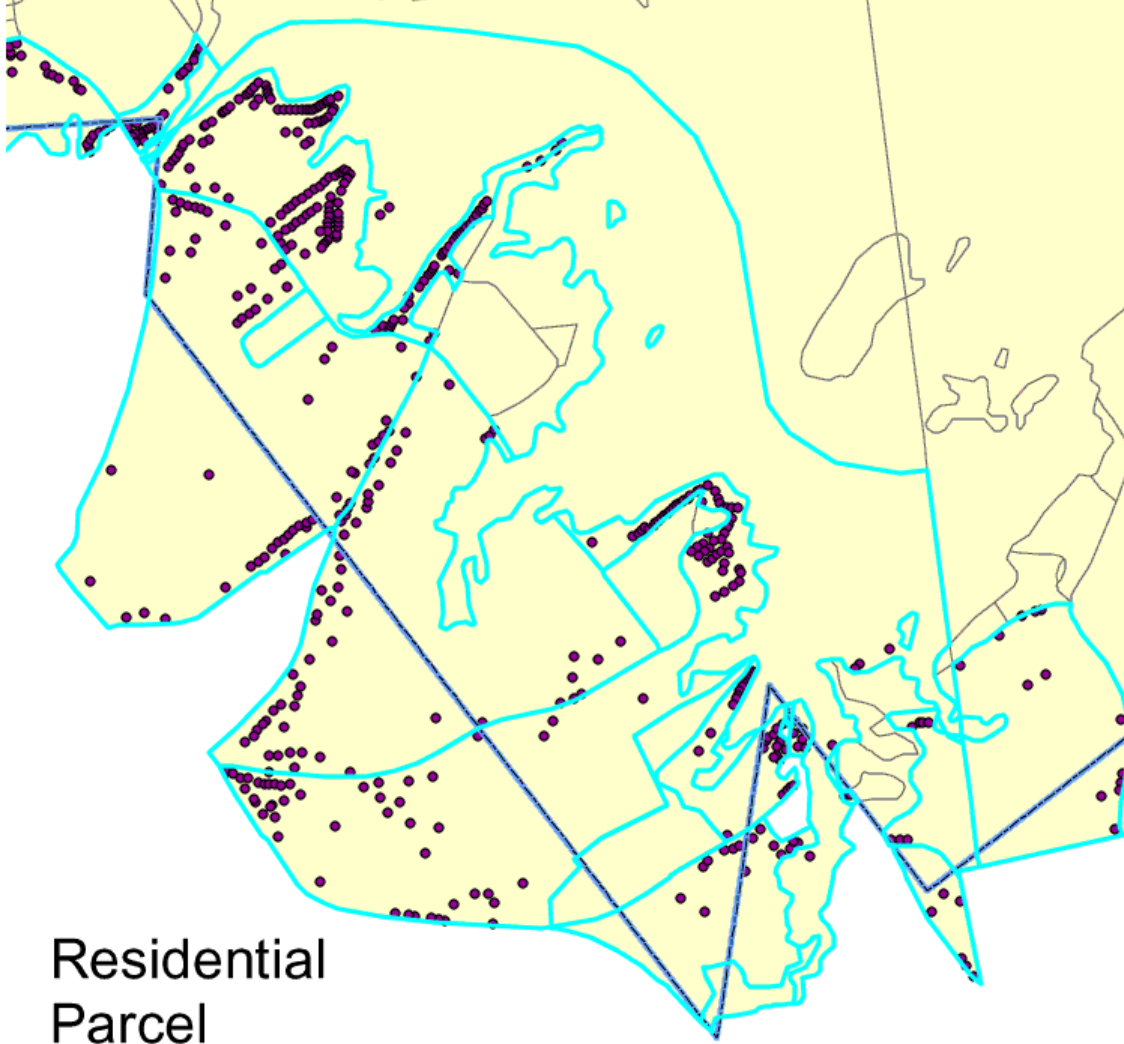
Counties are labeled with total

Census Blocks Split by the Blueline

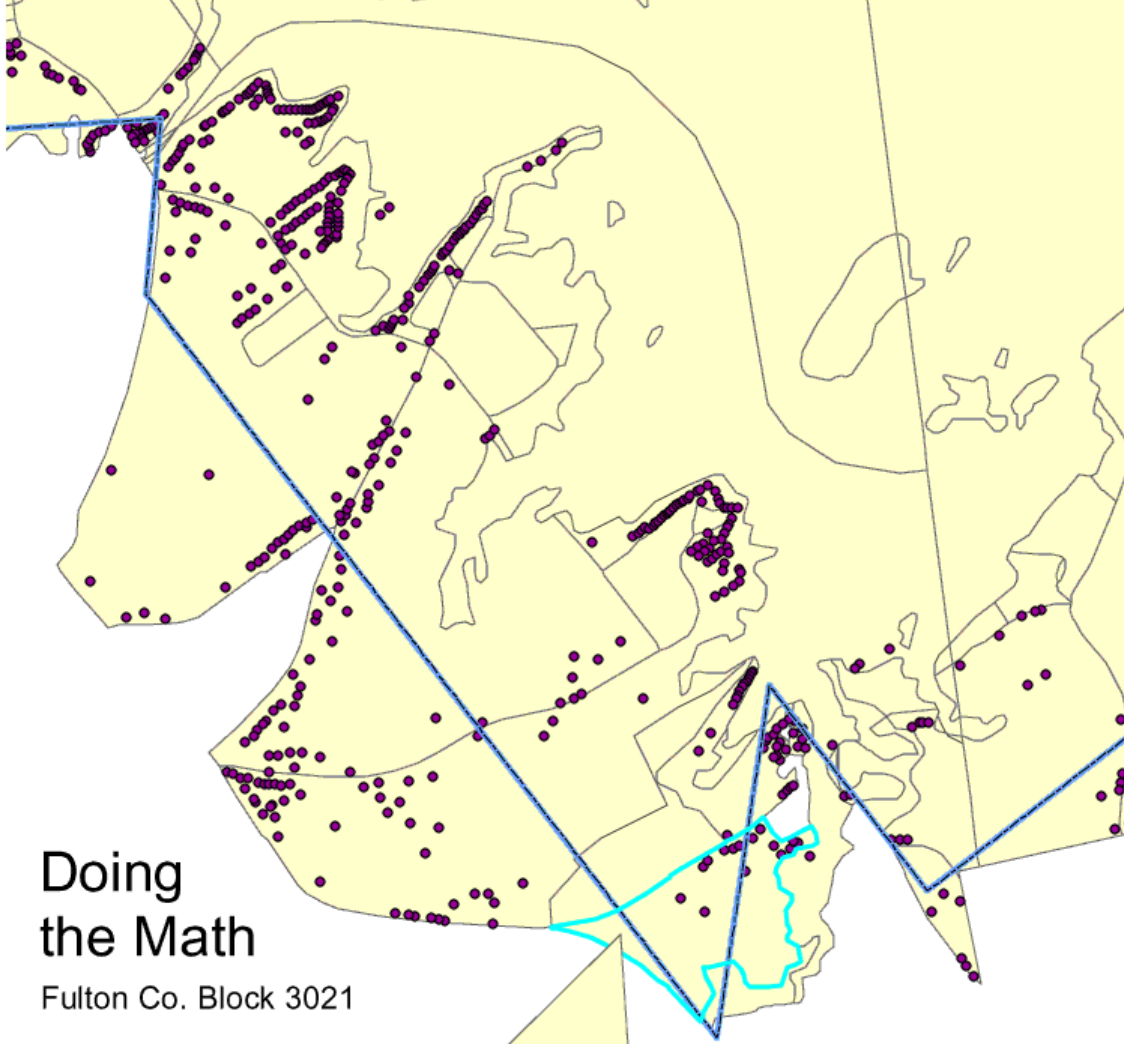




Fulton County inset of

Centroids



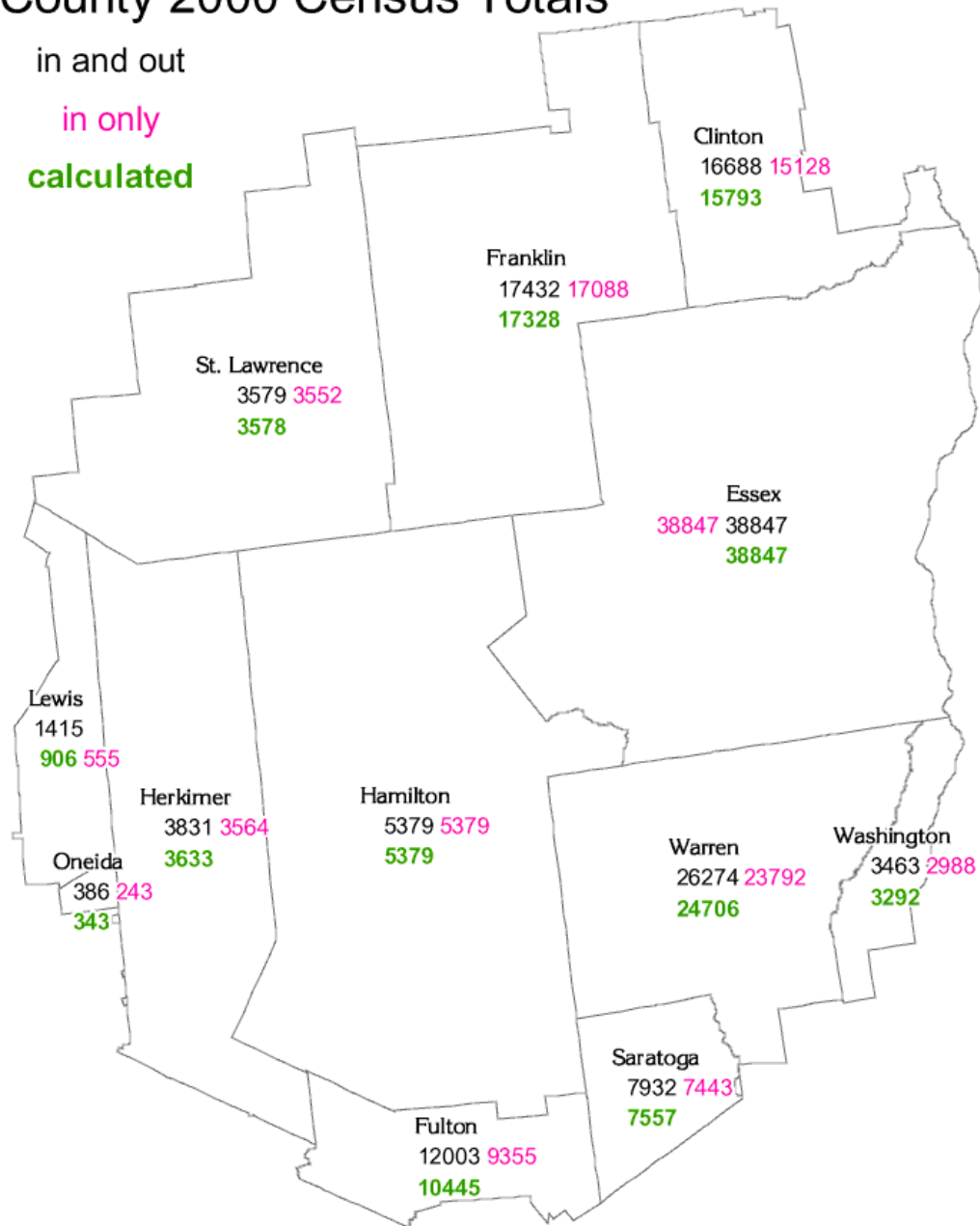
Doing the Math
