



Outdoor Recreation Economy





Adirondack Park Visitor Use Management – Foundational Information



APA Act, §801 – Statement of Legislative Finding and Purposes

"The Adirondack park is abundant in natural resources and open space unique to New York and the eastern United States. The wild forest, water, wildlife and aesthetic resources of the park, and its open space character, provide an outdoor recreational experience of national and international significance. Growing population, advancing technology and an expanding economy are focusing ever-increasing pressures on these priceless resources."

APA Act, §801 – Statement of Legislative Finding and Purposes

"The basic purpose of this article is to **insure** optimum overall **conservation, protection, preservation, development and use** of the unique scenic, aesthetic, wildlife, recreational, open space, historic, ecological and natural resources of the Adirondack park."



APA Act, §801 – Statement of Legislative Finding and Purposes


"Adoption of the land use and development plan and authorization for its administration and enforcement will complement and assist in the administration of the Adirondack park master plan for management of state land. Together, they are essential to the achievement of the policies and purposes of this article and will benefit all of the people of the state."

APA Act, §807 – Master Plan for Management of State Lands

- Classify such lands according to their characteristics and capacity to withstand use, and;
- Provide general guidelines and criteria for the management and use of lands
